## **Procedure for the Publication of Student Images and Work**

### Purposes of Publishing

The Flanshaw Road School (“the **School**”) uses a range of learning / teaching technologies to enhance student learning. In addition to the traditional publication of student’s images and work in school newsletters, these technologies include electronic mail (email) and the Internet. From time to time, the School publishes student’s images and work in a variety of locations such as the school newsletter, local papers and the school’s Internet website ([www.flanshawroad.school.nz](http://www.flanshawroad.school.nz)) material for educational purposes, to share the results of learning within the school community, and to promote the school within the wider community. This may include examples of students’ schoolwork and images of students and groups of students in activities at the school. Images of students may include scanned, digital, or video images of them taking part in school or class activities.

There are three main reasons the school publishes student’s images or work:

- 1 to educate the student in accordance with the national curriculum, including on the role and use of technology in society;
- 2 to encourage the student to be part of and participate in the school community;
- 3 to promote the school in the wider community.

### **Guideline 1**

The school will publish the material only on its own website ([www.flanshawroad.school.nz](http://www.flanshawroad.school.nz)) and New Zealand based websites endorsed by the Ministry of Education, such as the Ministry of Education’s website, The Online Learning Centre – Te Kete Ipurangi ([www.tki.org.nz](http://www.tki.org.nz)). The School may also recommend that student work, or the whole school website, be available through Te Kete Ipurangi.

### **Guideline 2**

The school publishes student material online for the following three main purposes:

- 1 to educate the student in accordance with the national curriculum, including on the role and use of technology in society;
- 2 to encourage the student to be part of and participate in the school community;
- 3 to promote the school in the wider community
